### Eleanor Deane Cates Rousseau

On June 5, 2018, Eleanor Deane Cates Rousseau, age 92, passed away at her home in Newnan, GA. She was born on September 19, 1925 in Newnan to the late Herman Pratt Cates and Janie Cole Cates. In addition to her parents, she is preceded in death by her husband James Rousseau. She is survived by her step-children, Kenneth Rousseau, Hank and Denise Rousseau; niece, Kathy Parham and husband James; nephew, Chris Cates; great-nephews, Mark Parham, Shawneen Parham, Brenden Parham; sister, Ruby Cates, and brother, Herman "Princeton" Cates.
